Camp staff and 32 youth enjoyed four days at Camp Shenandoah Meadows in Fort Valley the last week of July. This was the first youth camp sponsored by the Blue Ridge Region CBC.



Rising 6th through 12th graders from Antioch, Calvary, Columbia Furnace and St. Luke churches met in a spirit of unity to learn more about building a relationship with their Lord Jesus and to make new friends. No one was left out as they met each morning at 8:30 for breakfast, worship, and a video from a study by Louis Giglio, "Don't Let the Enemy Have a Seat at your Table."

After the video the kids broke into small groups for further discussion. Then it was time for games and crafts where they worked up an appetite for lunch. After lunch the gang enjoyed free time for swimming, kayaking and fishing.

They really wanted their camp director (Dale Bennett) to get wet, so they teased him about drowning so he would jump into the pool with them! Always thinking ahead, Dale replied he'd have to breathe life back into them by giving them CPR. That usually ended it!!

A hearty supper was served at 5:00. Three guest speakers (Pastors George Bowers, Darren Howdyshell and Freddie Helsley) joined the campers for evening worship. Music was

a high point of the evening activities which usually concluded around 10 pm.

These were full days for the youth, and they gained a new understanding of how Satan worms his way into their lives and how they can be on the look-out for Satan's tricks.

Guatemala Youth Mission Trip

On July 9, 2023, six individuals set out at 1:15 am from Antioch Church, headed for the Baltimore airport where we would join 11 others from the Petersburg, WV area. After 2 flights and a 5-hour layover, we landed in Guatemala City, Guatemala, and headed to San Lucas where Adam Clemmons hosted us for the night and blessed the group with his testimony. High on the mountain top we were able to see smoke from a nearby volcano and met Pastor Walter and his wife who lead the Miracle Fishing CBC Congregation in Guatemala.



The next day we headed to our main destination, San Juan La Laguna, and the home of Tom Palmer, a retired teacher from California. To get there we traveled by bus to Panachel and then by boat to San Juan La Laguna. Over the next 6 days our group of 17 installed 15 cook stoves, gave out 200 bags of food along with a Bible for each, painted, and held a field day for New Dawning Christian School located in San Juan.



The cookstoves that were installed replaced unventilated cookstoves that allowed the toxic smoke to fill the room/home as well as the lungs of anyone therein. Five of the stoves were built in homes in San Pablo, and the other 10 were installed in homes in the towns of Santa Clara and Palestina. Carrying the heavy cement parts, as well as the 11 cinder blocks to go with each, was not an easy task. There is no such thing as flat land in these mountain towns. In addition, our group had to carry each piece down winding paths or

up steep hills. We were blessed with strong young men and women in our group, and us "older" people were grateful for them! After installation the group prayed over each new stove and family. Along the way we handed out soccer balls and pumps to children along the road and at a local school.

Our group visited two churches where we handed out bags of food and Bibles to local families who seem very grateful for them. The bags included oil, pasta's, rice, seasonings, etc. While some were building stoves, others painted the gymnasium at the New Dawning Christian School. Painting cinder block while dodging the balls of children and trying to keep them out of the wet paint kept us on alert. The last full day in San Juan our group provided a field day for the school kids. We played games such



as dizzy bat and make up relays, and provided a lunch for all. At the end of the day we said our <u>goodbye's</u> to the school principal, Francisco, and prepared for our departure in the morning. On Friday we headed back towards Guatemala City and stayed the night in Antigua, a beautiful old town full of life. After mechanical and weather issues, which caused us to sleep on the airport floor one night and book a motel for another, we

arrived home safely two days after our intended return.

Our time in Guatemala was blessed by the smiles of the locals, small miracles, and great fellowship. Our group from Antioch was additionally blessed to partner with CBC Pastor Craig Howard, and his amazing group. Future trips are planned for both adults and youth in 2024 so plan to participate.
