# Let's take a look at what our Teams have been doing throughout the year:

## **Prayer Team Report-Pastor Jonathan Martino**

The regional prayer team took a break over the summer and picked back up in the month of September. The committee spent its time praying for various churches, activities, and functions within the region and denomination as a whole. The committee also has brought to the attention of the greater denomination and region the prayer needs for the body of Christ to come together in prayer. Beginning in 2026, Diane Pence will chair this team.

## **Ministry Leadership Team – Darren Howdysell**

Over the past year, the Ministry Leadership Team has been actively working to strengthen and support pastoral ministry within the Blue Ridge Region. Our efforts have centered on encouragement, training, and accountability, with the goal of equipping pastors and leaders to serve faithfully and fruitfully in their local congregations.

One of our greatest priorities has been building fellowship and strengthening relationships among our pastors. Last December, our first annual Pastors' Christmas Party welcomed 20 attendees. This year, our second gathering—held on December 1 at Antioch Church in Woodstock—grew to 32, a sign of the growing unity within our region. Gatherings like this remind us how much joy, encouragement, and strength we find when we come together as brothers and sisters in ministry.

At the beginning of 2025, we celebrated the ordinations of two pastors, Dale Bennett and Phillip Noel, both of whom are now serving actively and making a meaningful impact in our region. Most recently, on November 30, we ordained Tim Munson, and we currently have several others moving faithfully through the ordination process.

Alongside our ordained ministers, we continue to walk closely with our licensed ministers—pastors in training who are discerning God's call. We currently have four licensed ministers: Diane Pence, Chris Payne, Theresa Palmer, and Dakota Baker. We anticipate this number will continue to grow in the coming years, and we ask for your continued prayers for their spiritual growth, discernment, and readiness.

A major step forward this year was the establishment of the Ministry Training Team, commissioned by the Regional Leadership Team. This team consists of both ordained and lay leaders: Jonathan Farmer, Janet Elsea, Jon Prater, Doug Hughes, and Brian Crickenberger. Their responsibilities include offering continuing education opportunities, coordinating mentoring relationships, promoting the Brethren Bible Institute, and assisting in the launch of the new national Ministry Training Program—an eventual 16-course curriculum designed to prepare future ministers for service.

This year we also worked diligently to ensure that all ordained ministers in the region completed the required ethics training course and the necessary continuing education to renew their ordination through 2030. In addition to classes held at Annual Meeting and Worship Conference, our region hosted two ethics training sessions to give every pastor an opportunity to fulfill this requirement. This training is essential in ensuring that our pastors uphold the ministry standards expected within the Covenant Brethren Church. Over the next five years, each pastor will also be responsible for completing 30 hours of continuing education and spiritual growth—documented through the CEU portal—along with one additional ethics course.

As of today, the Blue Ridge Region is blessed with 29 licensed and ordained pastors serving God faithfully. We give thanks and praise for the way He continues to call, equip, and sustain ministers within the Covenant Brethren Church.

## **Mission Team – Gary Wingfield & Lee Landes**

In May of 2025, members and pastors of the Blue Ridge Region CBC came together at Barren Ridge Church for a “brainstorming” session to begin a Missions Outreach Team for the region. The group enthusiastically supported working with Samaritan’s Purse and was encouraged by the CBC’s decision to partner with such a strong Christ-centered ministry. Gary Wingfield volunteered to oversee the Disaster Relief Ministry and Lee Landes, volunteered to lead Operation Christmas Child Ministry. A speaker from Samaritan’s Purse had already been asked to speak at the Regional Conference, so the team decided to also host a shoebox packing event at our Fall Regional Meeting. Churches would be encouraged to donate items, and the youth would be invited to help pack shoeboxes as a regional activity. The Leadership Team challenged the region to pack two hundred shoeboxes. At our July Mission Meeting at Community Mission Church in Woodstock, a key concern was that each box would be packed with quality items. Becky Leland, from Antioch CBC suggested that churches be given options to either donate money or purchase specific items on Amazon. This would help ensure all donations were accounted for and of good quality. As of the deadline of October 1st, over half of the items were purchased by individuals and churches of the Regional CBC. Gary Wingfield and his wife offered to have the items shipped to their home and to take to Barren Ridge. Also, at that time more than \$4,500 was donated toward the shipping and to purchase the remaining items on the Amazon list. The remaining funds would be used to purchase “The Greatest Journey” training resources for children all over the world who have received a shoebox to learn more about Jesus in a 12-week study. We know with God’s blessing, that we will have a wonderful and successful packing party with the youth and non-delegates packing shoeboxes during the Regional Conference. With the effort and prayers of all the churches of the Blue Ridge Region, we will be the “hands and feet” of Jesus as we help reach children in some of the most isolated areas of the world to know the gospel. We are excited about the packing party and what we will do next year to support the wonderful Samaritan’s Purse Ministry of Operation Christmas Child. Gary will be representing the team and our region in conjunction with planning and coordination of Samaritan’s Purse disaster response. It honestly took a while to understand both my role and how the Samaritan’s Purse dynamic operated. We are still working through that process as I have not yet been able to get scheduled for a trip for myself or a team of volunteers. I have discovered that the disaster response scheduling process takes a little longer than expected. They schedule trips no earlier than 4 months in advance and the trips fill in very quickly. We have put together a mailing list of contacts for reaching out to potential volunteers. We found that the trips were already booked through the end of this year. I initially requested a booking for our region the second week in March and was informed that they normally reserve that time for college students to participate during their spring breaks. I then changed the request to be the last week in February. I also placed a request for myself for joining one of the already scheduled trips so that I can get some first-hand experience with their operation. I have not yet received confirmation on either request. I was very pleased that after sending out the request for volunteers, it did not take long to fill the maximum number of volunteers for that trip. We in fact have one person on a stand-by status. We will keep track of people who would like to volunteer when the max is reached simply because in my experience, there are unforeseen circumstances that arrive that prevent persons from keeping their commitment. Our church, Barren Ridge, has purchased a van with the intent of using for various reasons, one of which is mission response in our community. Our church decided to make the van available to serve as transportation for volunteers from our region to disaster rebuild sites. One of our designated drivers will need to be available for the trip. I really look forward to partnering with Samaritan’s Purse in disaster response. Gary is still trying to get mission trips scheduled. They seem to be doing more individuals instead of large groups. He will try to put together a time to talk with everyone who wants to go on a mission trip to see if it would be better to try to do smaller groups. Beginning in 2026, Gary Wingfield will chair this team.

## Regional Elders-Jon Prater

Jon Prater met with Barren Ridge Church in their search for a Pastor. The Elders also helped with the search for a pastor for St Luke. Pastor George, Pastor Henry and Pastor Jon have met several times and all Churches have met with an Elder. Ethics training is very important, and they feel the spiritual health of the region is very good. They ordained Tim Munson on November 30<sup>th</sup> and have a couple more coming soon.

## Congregational Life Team -Dale Bowers

The Blue Ridge Region Congressional Life Team met in June at the home of Dale and Lisa Bowers. We performed a 2025 camp season critique. We were informed that Shenandoah Meadows will not be available for the 2026 camping season which caused us to scramble to find a new camp for the summer of 2026. The Blue Ridge Region CBC Church Camp will be held at the Highland Retreat in Bergton, VA for 2026. Senior and Junior camps will be held July 5<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> (Sunday evening through Thursday at 2 pm). Senior Camp will be for completed grades 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> and Junior Camp will be for completed grades 3<sup>rd</sup>-7<sup>th</sup>. Summer camp is a great opportunity for youth to grow closer to Christ, make new friendships and unplug from their electronic world. A Regional Love Feast has been suggested for the summer of 2026. Dale Bowers will chair this team for 2026.

Below is a brief description of what each team does. Please prayerfully consider becoming a servant.

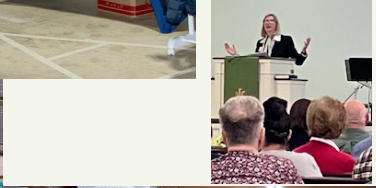
Overall, it was a wonderful, uplifting evening, and we're already looking forward to doing it again next year.

## **Volunteer Youth leader for Blue Ridge Region**

We recognize this is a tall order for an unpaid position. Yet, we also recognize the distinct importance of youth ministry, especially for those churches who have very small numbers and may not be able to sustain youth ministry within their congregations. It is the Board's desire that, over time, our budget will allow for this position to become a paid one, but for now, we pray that God will call someone to step in and step up to this very important ministry within our region.

### **REGIONAL YOUTH DIRECTOR ~ VOLUNTEER(S)**

The Blue Ridge Regional Youth Director(s) will be primarily responsible for developing resilient Jesus followers by helping students develop a Biblical worldview and strong personal faith. With the direction and help of the Regional Board, give thoughtful planning, preparation and leadership for regional students of middle school and high school. This would include online and/or in person Bible study, discipleship, praise/worship, evangelism, missions' education, missions' involvement and fellowship events in a safe (physically and emotionally) and engaging environment.

#### **B. Qualifications**

1. The Youth Director(s) shall have a passion for Jesus that is contagious.
2. This person shall be an approachable and outgoing Christian, a member in good standing of a Covenant Brethren Church and in agreement with the Covenant Brethren Statement of Faith.
3. This person shall have a genuine commitment to the gospel of Jesus Christ and a sense of divine call to Youth ministry.
4. This person must have the ability to plan, organize, direct and lead the Youth Ministry of a dynamic and growing region.
5. This person shall have sufficient skills to relate Bible teachings and applications to real life questions and situations that apply to youth and their families in an increasingly challenging culture.
6. It is our desire that they shall be gifted with the ability to meaningfully interact and communicate with youth and their families to build lasting relationships.
7. This person shall be willing to empower and lead a team of ministry volunteers if needed.

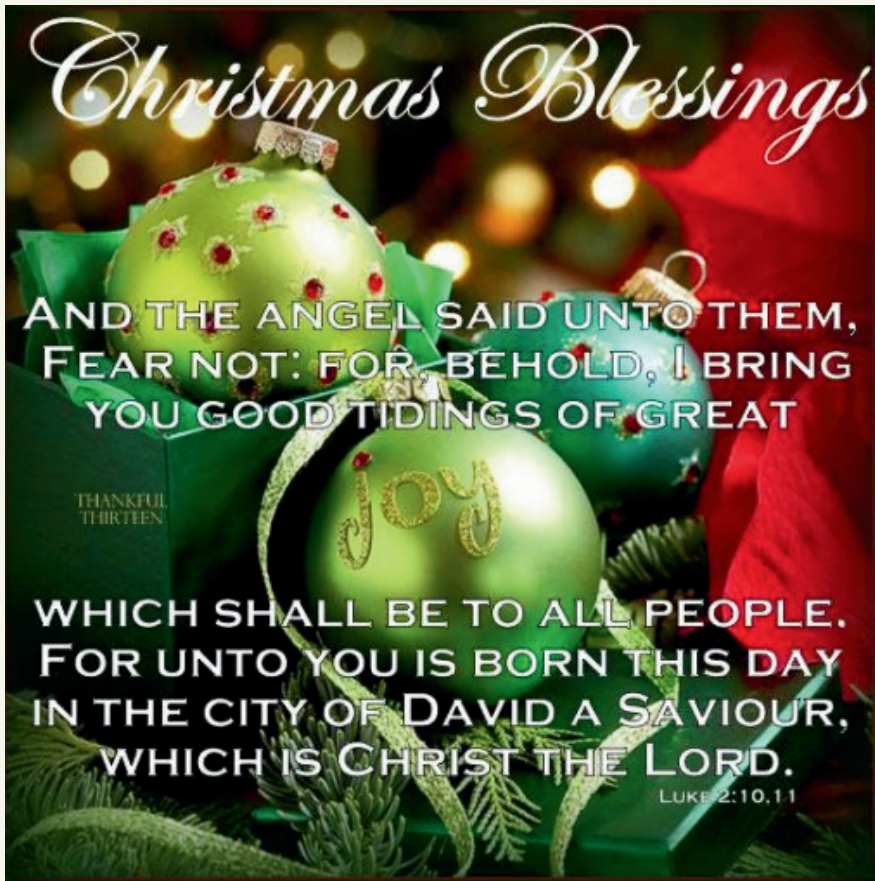
#### **C. Responsibilities**

1. Serve and support the vision, mission and plans of the Blue Ridge Region of the Covenant Brethren Church.
2. Leadership
  - a. Inspire students and their families to know and follow Jesus while developing a Biblical worldview that promotes cultural discernment.
  - b. Create a dynamic, meaningful and safe (physically and emotionally) atmosphere for spiritual growth among youth.
  - c. Over time, strategize, create and implement an action plan to develop a growing and vibrant ministry to youth including Bible study, discipleship, praise/worship, evangelism, missions education, missions involvement, outreach, service, intergenerational involvement and fellowship in collaboration with the Blue Ridge Board and ministry volunteers.

- d. Coordinate and lead regular youth programming and/or other youth activities in collaboration with the Blue Ridge Regional Board and ministry volunteers.
  - e. Assist and/or lead the Planning, implementation of activities and visit or attend youth summer camps, retreats, mission events, fundraisers and/or other regionally sanctioned youth events as time permits.
- 3. Communication**
- a. Be willing and able to effectively communicate with volunteers, youth and parents with schedules, responsibilities and activities
  - C. Prepare a Youth report prior to Regional Board meetings and attend such meetings if so requested.
- 4. Safety**
- a. Oversee the safety of youth ministry space.
  - c. Create/maintain Family Orientation and Ministry Volunteer handbooks if they become necessary
  - d. Ensure proper completion of background checks for all youth ministry volunteers prior to their participation with the assistance of the Board and Administrative Assistant
- 6. The Youth Director shall:**
- a. Be under the direct supervision of and report directly to the Congregational Life/Focused Planning Team.
  - b. Work in close cooperation with the Blue Ridge Regional Board.
  - d. Collaborate with the Covenant Brethren Church national Youth Director to plan calendars that allow for denominational Youth events.
- D. Compensation and Benefits**
- 1. Compensation shall begin with mileage and expenses.
  - 2. Compensation, should the budget allow, will be an hourly rate, not to exceed 10 hours per week or 20 hours for a weekend event and may be adjusted as needed by Blue Ridge Regional Board.
